#### **Directions to Janet Bradley's Estate:**

Cross the Columbia River from Oregon into Washington on either I-5 or I-205. Exit to Camas - go east on Highway 14 (along the river). Eight miles from I-5 or two miles from I-205, exit at SE 164th Avenue. Turn left onto 164th. Go north for four miles (SE 164th becomes NE 162nd). After the stoplight at NE 39th ST, 162nd narrows to two lanes. Janet lives in the first house on the right past NE 39th St. It is an old farmhouse surrounded by trees. Entering the second driveway is best. Park in front of or beside the barn. Janet's phone is (360) 892-7833.

### at the *Illuminata Parade of Light*

The CAP September meeting will be **Saturday**, September 21 at 7:00 pm at the *Illuminata Parade of Light*. This will be our second consecutive meeting not held on a Thursday. (Oh Heavens, whatever shall we do). We'll announce the assembly point in the next newsletter.

For those of you who were at last year's *Illuminata* you will remember just how special it was. For those of you who weren't, the information below should prove helpful. We encourage all CAP members to attend this special event.

#### **What is the *Illuminata Parade of Light*?**

The *Illuminata Parade of Light*, a benefit for Portland Parks & Recreation, is designed to provide a sense of community to the people of Portland in a way that literally lights up the city. During the day, the celebration will showcase the many programs offered by Portland Parks & Recreation and their partners, along with live music, diverse entertainment and lantern-making for the public.

As the day falls to dusk, Portlanders will gather along the Eastbank Esplanade with their homemade lanterns and walk the parade route. Along the way, specialty artisan lanterns will come to life, lighting the way for a truly magical evening.

The year 2001 marked the first annual *Illuminata Parade*, which celebrated the completion of the Eastbank Esplanade and drew nearly 10,000 participants who created hand made lanterns weeks prior to the event, or on-site before the parade began.

#### **When will the *Illuminata Parade of Light* take place?**

Festivities leading up to the *Illuminata Parade of Light* will begin weeks before the event in the form of artist-hosted, lantern-making workshops. The 2002 *Illuminata Parade of Light* is scheduled to take place on Saturday, September 21 beginning at 3:00 pm. From 3:00 pm until sundown, Portlanders can learn all about what Portland Parks & Recreation and their partner organizations offer to the community. The Parade of Light will begin at dusk.

#### **Where will the *Illuminata Parade of Light* take place?**

The festivities will take place on the southeast corner of the Eastbank Esplanade, in the Festival Plaza (Where SE Madison meets the Willamette River bank). After sundown, the parade begins and works its way north to the Morrison Bridge, across to Waterfront Park, proceeds south on Waterfront Park and back across the Hawthorne Bridge to the Eastbank Esplanade.

#### **About the Beneficiary:**

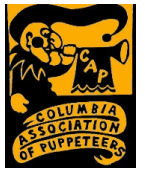
